DocType Permissions

Do the content editors need the ability to create certain DocTypes?










Tabs and Groups

Helps avoid a wall of properties.

Use Tabs to group properties by usage (e.g. Content, SEO, Page Settings etc..)

Move lesser-used properties away from the main content

Make sure the most commonly used properties are easily available, in the first tab, so that the content editor doesn't have to go hunting for them.









Aliases are for Developers




















And don't skip the descriptions!

- Is a property used as a fallback or an override? State it in the description
- Make sure they are written in an Editor Friendly way, avoid developer slang
- Not every property needs a description








DocType Descriptions

Keep them clear, short and concise!


Use MCP to do a first draft pass






Don't forget the icons!


Make it easy for your content editors to distinguish the different content types, so they can quickly find what they're looking for.

- Thumbnails





You can usually get by with the default Property Editors.







Custom Dashboards, Sections & Content Apps

Provide extra functionality to the client, tailoring the backoffice to their needs.












Custom Login Screen



- Fill in the values of Read Only properties










The Dashboard - Markus Johansson

The welcome dashboard is the first thing your content editors see, and the default one is mostly useless to them, so let's replace it with something much more useful!



Attribution (Cymraeg)

Images should be attributed to their creator as per the license agreement under which they were procured.



How to attribute images

Unless you're using an image that has been published under a <u>Creative Commons Zero</u> (CCO) license, attribution is a legal requirement. The Creative Commons (CC) framework defines attribution as giving "appropriate credit," which some people mistakenly believe is open to interpretation. In fact, what CC means is TASL, a simple and flexible method that accounts for the requirements of the various CC licenses.




To make sure images are correctly attributed, include the following details and make sure they are clearly displayed by the relevant image (ideally directly underneath):

- Title: The title of the image.
- · Author: The name of the creator.
- · Source: The URL where the image is hosted (plus optional link to author profile).
- License: The type of Creative Commons license it is available under, including a link to the relevant license.

According to Creative Commons, an ideal example of TASL would be:

"Winter in town", by David J, licensed under CC BY 2.0










Skybrud Redirects - Anders Bjerner

Gives your content editors the ability to create, edit and delete custom redirects!








Block Preview - Rick Butterfield

Re-use your frontend views and styles as the backoffice block previews!

Eliminates the need to maintain a completely separate set of preview files!

Make it part of your PR Reviews





Does the Pull Request contain new DocTypes and properties? Then as part of the review, you should:

- Check if they have appropriate labels and descriptions
- Check if they made use of existing compositions
- Check if the DocType is structured nicely using groups and tabs



Get Feedback Early!

The best way to know if your Umbraco setup is editor-friendly is to ask the people using it!

Create a user guide!





By putting in the time and effort to think about the needs of content editors, we can make Umbraco truly live up to its "Friendly CMS" label.
